

### FOUNDER MESSAGE

The year 2025 began with a strong focus on strategic alignment as Green-Kenya invested in strengthening systems and solidifying the foundations of its five divisions: Women Up, Coach Education, Environmental Literacy, Social Impact, and the Football Academy. The first half of the year was dedicated to planning, restructuring, and capacity building, ensuring that our coaches and coordinators were well equipped with clear objectives, performance indicators, and inclusive, child-centered approaches.

Quarter 3 marked a powerful shift from preparation to impact, as Green-Kenya expanded its reach and deepened community engagement. Through initiatives including Women Up, and Community Impact, we reached over 9,000 Children in Nairobi and Mombasa, addressing critical social issues such as gender equality, child protection, and drug abuse through sport-based interventions.



The final quarter of the year brought both notable achievements and operational challenges, including field access limitations, school closures, and holiday-related disruptions. Despite these constraints, our teams demonstrated remarkable adaptability by adjusting schedules, relocating sessions, and maintaining program continuity. These experiences strengthened our resilience and sharpened our planning and resource management capabilities. As we conclude 2025, Green-Kenya stands more strategic, more resilient, and deeply committed to leveraging sport as a catalyst for long-term, sustainable social change in the communities we serve.


### Education


